Northwest Texas Healthcare System has earned The Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval® and the American Heart Association/American Stroke Association's Heart-Check mark for Advanced Certification for Primary Stroke Centers again for 2019. These are both symbols of quality from their respective organizations. Recognizing the "BE-FAST" warning signs of a possible stroke and calling 9-1-1 right away if you see symptoms are key to surviving and having the best possible outcome. The acronym stands for: Balance, Eyes, Face, Arms, Speech, Time.

## Giving a voice to ventilated patients

Being able to talk during recovery can be gamechanging for patients with a breathing tube (or "trach tube"). Northwest Texas Healthcare System is committed to advancing this objective and recently became the first trauma facility in the U.S. to be designated a PassyMuir® Center of Excellence for its work in this area.

The award recognizes outstanding teamwork, education and utilization of the PassyMuir Valve, a device that enables patients to speak and eat while they are on a ventilator. "This gives patients a sense of hope, empowerment and motivation," says Buffy Buchanan, supervisor of speech pathology. A key to success involved forming a multidisciplinary trach team to care for patients and provide training on the valve. Subsequently, Northwest has seen a decrease in ventilator dependence, a decrease in the occurrence of aspiration pneumonia, and a 50 percent reduction in patients' length of stay!



## Steering clear of the jitters

Surgery can be scary. However, thanks to a generous donation of remote-control cars, young patients at Northwest Surgical Hospital can get their minds off their procedure and onto something more fun by driving themselves to the operating room. The miniature cars were donated by Chauncey's Automotive and are equipped with safety belts and a horn, for use by children between the ages of 3 and 10 years old. "We are hopeful that this is something that children will look forward to," says Keisha Bailey, BSN, CNOR, director of surgical services at Northwest.

#### Keith Bandy says he knew the team at Northwest was going to do everything they could when he needed emergency care. And they did.

he rugged beauty of the Palo Duro Canyon attracts off-road bike riders from throughout the Texas Panhandle and beyond to enjoy its scenic cliffs and trails. That's where Keith Bandy was riding his dirt bike when his unexpected accident occurred.

"I remember the whole thing vividly," he says. He was in the canyon with some other guys working on building a race track for an upcoming off-road event. "I don't race, I never have," he says, but he's loved dirt bike riding since he was a kid. "We were done for the day and were heading back to the truck." He's not sure why, but suddenly the front wheel of his bike came off and was thrown over his head, causing him to go soaring into the air and crashing to the ground. Initially the wind was knocked out of him and he couldn't breathe. "I laid there for a second thinking, am I okay?"

The guys he was with rushed to help him, and after being taken to the nearest hospital, he was airlifted to Northwest, where X-rays and other tests revealed broken ribs, a broken shoulder, a cracked sternum and two shattered vertebrae. "It was all done in rapid succession," says his wife, Shelbie, of the testing conducted to confirm the extent of his injuries. "They were an awesome team."

Thankfully, despite the many broken bones, he did not suffer a spinal cord injury and has no neurological deficit. "I'm just grateful," Shelbie adds. "God was with him."

He spent the next two weeks at the hospital, where he had two bars implanted into his spine to stabilize his body while it healed. For his wife, a nurse by training, her biggest concern was that he be kept comfortable and still so his spine would be protected from potential damage. "It really struck me how involved the entire facility was in how he was doing," she recalls. At the time, she was working in the emergency room for a different hospital outside the area, but when her husband's health stabilized, she applied for a nursing position at Northwest and has been working there ever since.

Today, Bandy has recovered and is back to his routine. He says his shoulder area tires more easily than it used to, but other than being

a little more fatigued, he can do the things he enjoys. "It's nothing like it could have been," he says, grateful for the emergency care he received.

He and his wife recall how Northwest has been there for them and their family over the years, including when their daughter, now 22, was born prematurely and spent 3 ½ months in the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU), which is the largest in the region. Having the support of the caring hospital team has changed their lives in more ways than one. "Absolutely Northwest is my hospital," Bandy says. "We are very blessed." ■

# Reassuring care ... from hip to collarbone



When Jessica Blaser, a busy mom of six, needed help for her hip pain, she was concerned about what treatment might entail. Finding a doctor she could trust was important to her. When she met with orthopedic surgeon Blake Obrock, DO, of Northwest Texas Physician Group at Ridgeview, she was immediately reassured by his skilled assessment and his honesty.

"A lot of times, treatment does not involve surgery, and you can give people the stability they need by working on functional mechanics," Dr. Obrock explains.

in her hip and her back, and he recommended that the best course of treatment would be physical therapy. He was very encouraging about her getting a second opinion, which she appreciated. "I want a doctor who can look at other sides," she says. The second doctor confirmed Dr. Obrock's recommendation, and physical therapy proved to be just what she needed.

Around that same time, Blaser's 13-year-old son, Duke, broke his collarbone in a football game and also went to see Dr. Obrock. This time, surgery was recommended. Dr. Obrock, a fellowship-trained sports medicine surgeon, explains that treatment for collarbone injuries is evolving, and letting them heal on their own is not always advised. "If a clavicle (collarbone) shortens up too much, it really affects people's overhead strength, it affects their ability to throw a ball ... and sometimes

when it doesn't heal right they may be plagued with pain for the rest of their life."

Hospital took about an hour, and he was able to remove his sling and use his arm after just a couple of days. "They were very gentle with him and very careful," says Blaser. Today she and Duke are both doing great, but if she needs hip surgery in the future, she knows where she can go. "I'm sure I'll be at Northwest," she says. ■

# A new freestanding ED

To expand access to emergency care, Northwest Emergency on Georgia has opened at the intersection of I-27 and Georgia (4121 S. Georgia Street) in Amarillo. The new freestanding emergency department provides comprehensive 24/7 treatment backed by the full resources of Northwest Texas Healthcare System. Laboratory and imaging services are also offered. Most insurance plans, including Medicare, Medicaid, and most BCBS®, are accepted.

Jason Madsen, Associate Administrator at Northwest, says that one of the goals is to enhance access to services in the south and east sides of Amarillo since there were no emergency rooms on that side of town. "In an emergency, this will save a lot of time."

Northwest Emergency on Georgia is staffed with the same personnel and equipment available in Northwest Texas Healthcare System's hospitalbased emergency room. For conditions that warrant admission to a hospital, the staff can assist patients with a direct admission to Northwest or a transfer to a hospital of their choice.

Expansive lab services are available on an outpatient basis for individuals with a physician's order and include: CT scans, digital X-rays, complete blood counts (CBCs), lipid profiles (to check cholesterol and triglycerides), diabetic screenings, infectious disease screening (flu, hepatitis, etc.), thyroid function testing and others.

On the other side of town, patients can continue to receive 24/7 care at Northwest Emergency at Town Square. Both Northwest facilities are the only freestanding emergency departments operating under a hospital license in the area.
